Important Notice: All Exhibitors must purchase either a Membership, Privilege/Exhibitor Ticket or the Exhibitor Fee and complete the Open Class Entry Blank in fair book or Online at www.clarkcoag.com.

\$30.00 Society Membership: Exhibitor may make unlimited entries unless limited by a department rule. This includes (8) daily admissions, Society voting privileges in the annual director's election. Exhibitor must be a resident of Clark County and 18 years of age.

\$30.00 Privilege/Exhibitor: Exhibitor may make unlimited entries unless limited by a department rule. This includes (8) daily admissions.

\$5.00 Exhibitor Fee: Exhibitor may make unlimited entries unless limited by a department rule. Does NOT include admittance to the fair.

ARTS & CRAFTS Building Hours are 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. daily. Exhibits may be dropped off Friday, **July 19, 2024** between 3:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. (*Note: For your convenience, please bring entries early if possible!)

*Note: Produce Area will be closed at 9:00 a.m. Saturday, **July 20th** until judging is completed.

Hours: Sunday, **July 21** through Thursday **July 25** - 11:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. Friday, **July 26** - 11:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

Entry Guide

- Entry forms may be obtained online at www.clarkcoag.com or pick up an entry form at the Clark County Fair Office at 4401 S. Charleston Pike, Springfield, Ohio 45502. Entry deadline is **Monday, July 1, 2024**.
- Entries in Grains, Vegetables, and Fruits will close at 4:30 p.m. **July 1, 2024**. Mail entries to Clark County Fair or you may deliver them to the office of the Fair Management located on the Clark County Fairgrounds. Exhibitors wishing to enter only the Best Decorated Garden Tool or Best Painted Gourd contests must include a \$5.00 entry fee.
- As soon as entries are received in the Fair Office, confirmation of entries will be emailed if entry is made online. Tickets/passes will be available at the fair office within 24 hours of the confirmation of payment. If entry is mailed or dropped off at the fair office, tickets and confirmation will be available 24 hours after receipt. Please be sure your complete mailing address and phone number is placed on the entry blank.
- Entries are open to the World but no more than one entry will be permitted by any one exhibitor in any one class.

Produce Guide

- Entry tags for exhibits will be given to the Department Chairperson and will be placed on the exhibits when they are brought to the Fair.
- Exhibits can be brought to the ARTS & CRAFTS Building on Friday, **July 19, 2024** between **3:00** p.m. and 8:00 p.m. Exhibitor will be given a stub from each entry tag to reclaim their exhibit after the fair.
- Produce should be clean and presentable at the time it is brought in. All entries must be the current year's growth except those noted in Divisions 45 and 46,
- Judging time is 9:00 a.m. on Saturday, **July 20, 2024** and is closed to exhibitors.
- Exhibits must remain in place until released between 4:00 & 6:00 p.m. Friday, **July 26, 2024** by the department chairperson. Exhibitors' containers and ribbons must be picked up at this time. This department will not be responsible for remaining items.
- All unclaimed acceptable remaining vegetables will be donated to food charities.

Premium availability will be announced during the Fair, listen for announcements on Thursday. Out of county premium checks will be mailed if over \$5.00. Checks under \$5.00 will not be mailed.
