
2025 Honor Roll



A "future search" forum was developed with members of the board and community leaders to improve the Clark County Fairgrounds. Out of that journey we have the Champion Center and the purchase of the gravel pit lake property creating more parking and boat racing and the national headquarters of the APBA. Many updates of the fair include a new office and maintenance facility, remodeled sheep barn and Ole Show barn, dog barn, remodeled all restrooms, and a new swine show barn planned for 2025. New roofs on most buildings and A/C added in the 3-building complex. Numerous electrical upgrades and security lighting have been accomplished and security fencing to have all general admission to walk on the ground for added security. Jay has been chairman of the grounds committee for about 20 years and has been on many committees such as security, gates, camping, beef, and sales.

One of Jay's goals from the beginning was to run the fairgrounds as a business and make the fairgrounds self-sustaining. He has a great love of the fair and wants it to continue for many generations. He and his family are very involved in agriculture with their entire life as they also manage a large farm operation in SE Clark County, so he wants to see strength in agriculture not just here at the fairgrounds, but also the entire state and nation. At this point in his life, Jay is still very active but semi-retired allowing more time with their family, their farm, fun at Indian Lake, and of course the Fairgrounds.
